She left Scotland on June 1913 with her brother James to come to Canada. They docked first in Halifax then Quebec City and from there they took the train.

On May 1, 1919 she came from Toronto to Haileybury to be with her husband. She recalls the ice on the sidewalks on Browning Street as she walked from the train station to downtown. She didn't think much of the town at first coming from Toronto.

Her husband had been around this part of the north long before her. He was a miner and a prospector, and worked for years in the mines in Cobalt.

They lived in a house on Amwell Street for a year then moved to Georgina Ave. where she has lived ever since.

She remembers a man by the name of MacFarlane who built houses from boulders. He lived out the West Road.

The remainder of the interview dealt with personal affairs which did not pertain to the interview and Mrs. Milroy did not wish to discuss the early days here any further.
